


About us





What we heard from you


- We surveyed our parents in the 1st week of April

Staff and Administration

Teaching Staff

- 73% rated the teachers Good or Better
- 34% rated the teachers Excellent

Administration

- 78% rated the admin Good or Better
- 37% rated the administration Excellent



Curriculum

- Initial curriculum was based on Stanford
- Based on teacher and student feedback we are making some changes this year
- Islamic Studies:
- Moving to "Weekend Islamic Studies" text
- There will be fewer text books per class
- Qur'anic Studies:
