#### **Suffa or SBIAIS**

Since 2015, the Islamic weekend school has been called Suffa. However, this year the name was changed to South Bay Islamic Association Islamic School, or SBIAIS. A recent debate at our school is whether SBIAIS or Suffa is a more suitable name for our community's place of learning.

Some community members like the new name because "SBIAIS makes the school feel more connected and a part of the masjid," as said by Nuha Khan, president of the SBIA Youth Committee and a former student. The intention behind the name change was to closely tie the school to the SBIA mosque. This ensures the school remains affiliated with SBIA. One community member says, "The school name was changed because it was becoming a separate identity from SBIA and that had never been our intent. At its inception, Suffa was an SBIA initiative...The name change was done to avoid two separate brands and identities diverging". Afterall the school sprouted from the SBIA mosque and community.

Suffa refers to the place where companions of the Prophet who migrated to Madinah, known as Aṣhab al-Ṣuffah (Companions of the Suffa), stayed and studied the religion of Islam. It was located inside Masjid Al-Nabawi and this is where some of the most prominent Companions of the Prophet were educated, as explained by Imam Tahir Anwar.

7th Grade Qur'anic Studies teacher Tariq Afzal also tells us "This was a safe place for newly converts to practice their new religion in good company. This was also the first Islamic academy for regular learning of Islam. [Also,] residents of this small place wanted to stay [in] close proximity to the



beloved Prophet ما " He adds, "I believe these goals are still [the] utmost desirable in the environment that we live in...Just by having the same name of our institute we feel related to Aṣhab al-Ṣuffah and pray that we be raised

among their company [on] the Day of Judgement." Imam Tahir says, "We chose to name our school with this honorable name when we began at this location."

Many find it easier to pronounce Suffa since it is what they are familiar with. SBIAIS, on the other hand, can be difficult to pronounce and could be easily mixed up. Current Youth student Mehrish Khayam mentions how "Suffa is a better option because it [is] memorable and has history behind it. It is also easier to pronounce and people recognize that organization." Nuha Khan says, "Personally, as a former student, Suffa is always what I refer to on the Saturdays that I spend teaching at SBIA". Another member of our community says, "I do prefer the old [name] because that's the name I'm used to ever since Suffa opened and when I was a student as well." Community members still find themselves referring to the school with its previous name since they have spent many years making memories every Saturday at the school known as Suffa.

While SBIAIS does closely tie the school back to its originating mosque, a portion of our community collectively agrees that the name should be returned to Suffa because it has deep roots in our religion. #### **ChatGPT**

ChatGPT is a free artificial intelligence (AI) chatBot released in November 2022, that is used to generate human-like responses to virtually any question. It can explain quantum mechanics in simple terms to ideas for a teen birthday party, and even write a sonnet. ChatGPT was created by a non-profit company, OpenAI. The technology behind ChatGPT is an area of AI called Reinforcement Learning from Human Feedback (RLHF).

After using ChatGPT, I realized what a valuable resource it is, since it can answer all of my questions, even the ones about Islam. I asked it for different duas, stories of the prophets, and meanings of surahs. It makes a very efficient and simple virtual assistant, and provides easy-to-understand answers in a pleasant conversational tone. The ease of use of this chatBot was quickly recognized by the public as one million users registered within the first week of its launch.

However, it is imperative that ChatGPT output must be verified with the help of other trusted websites, search engines such as Google Search or Microsoft Bing, and other established sources on the subject. It has been noticed by users that sometimes while ChatGPT's answers seem plausible, they may contain misinformation.
